

The Muljibhai Madhvani Foundation, popularly known as just the Madhvani Foundation, is Uganda's oldest and largest private scholarship fund. It has existed since 1962 and was briefly disrupted in 1971 when President Idi Amin expelled Asians from Uganda but the fund resumed in 2003.

The scholarship which was established in memory of the late Muljibhai Prabhudas Madhvani aims at benefitting brilliant but needy Ugandans pursuing Undergraduate and Postgraduate studies at the University in Uganda.

In this pioneer issue of the Muljibhai Madhvani Foundation Newsletter under the theme 'Giving back to promote education in Uganda' we will look back and celebrate how far we have come and how many lives we have changed through the scholarship scheme.

From the revival of the scheme in 2003, Madhvani Foundation has increased its sponsorship to the

tune of over 550million helping over 600 students from an original 49 when it was launched. It is also fulfilling to know that many of those students who have gone through the Foundation scheme have gone on to become ambassadors for the Foundation through the quality of their work in their various careers.

Madhvani Foundation highly values education and we are very pleased by the number of responses we get from prospective beneficiaries especially female students and students in upcountry universities this has encouraged the Foundation to continue setting aside funds to facilitate those that would otherwise have not been able to complete their studies, these funds though need to be boosted in order for us to be able to increase the number of student beneficiaries, that is why we hope that those who benefit from the fund will be able to continue the cycle by supporting other needy students through the foundation. At the launch, the Alumni voted in its first Chairman, Roland Kokasi Odinga, a Consultant at DFCU Bank.

With this I urge you to support the foundation and our vision to promote higher education for the brilliant but needy students.

PRESSED BUT NOT CRUSHED: MY JOURNEY TO DISCOVERING SUCCESS

uddles, valleys and mountains are in the world but hope for a new day surpasses every other situation surrounding mankind. So also take my slogan 'never lose hope!'

Having lost a caring father early February 2005 I just thought the world had ended and I would be nowhere on earth. I that day became total orphan in an extended family my father had just left. Among the twenty six children left only five were independent only four have their mothers and the remaining had became total orphans including myself. Almost all of us were just left under the guardianship of our sister Naome whose earnings were even meager to cater for all of us. I thought of dropping out of school to look after the plantations or look for a small job so that I can take care of my young brothers and sisters.

Relief just came on my way one Saturday morning in April, 2005 when a family friend Mr. Venali Rugema took me to St. Leo's college, Kyegobe the school I had always for A' level. Amidst problems I passed well with fourteen points in HEL/G. This could not take me for government sponsorship nor could my guardian afford sponsoring me for law at Makererere University. A course my late father had prepared me to take. After a long discussion with my guardian Venali and sister Naome I opted to go for a cheap course Business Administration at Bishop Stuart University, Mbarara.


I saw my young brothers dropping out of school since my sister couldn't sponsor all of us. Her decision was to get me through first and when I finish then others go back to school on assumption that immediately as I finish campus I would get a job and take some load from her. dropouts since I was taking much money above a million shillings per semester. It always haunted me but I had nothing to do. I had thought of taking a dead year after first year such that my young brothers and sisters can also be pushed to at least A' level.

One day while discussing our family problems with my friend at campus Amanyire Samuel who was one year ahead of me told me about the Madhvani Foundation scholarships. Himself was on the same scheme having been relieved from the dead year he had taken. Amidst strong objection from my course mates and friends I applied and passed through. My friends and course mates had all along told me that it

needs you to canvas, bribe or be known to some body working in Madhvani group of companies in order to pass through which is not the case. Whom did I know on the scholarship committee? Whom did I bribe? No body but I passed through. I was once again redeemed to have hope for a clear future now that I was assured of tuition charges from Madhvani Foundation. I could receive the cheque for tuition on time so I wouldn't be chassed from exams as it had been before in first year when I was sponsoring myself. I got my self a nick name from the secretary to the academic registra calling me 'Madhvani' because of being on that scholarship. My life had just came back to normal.

GRATITUDE FOR THE MADHVANI FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP



THE FOUNDATION

The Muljibhai Madhvani Foundation is a Charitable Trust. One of the Foundation's primary objectives is to maintain and promote scientific and technical education among the people of Uganda. It is in pursuit of this objective that the Board of Trustees of the Foundation set up a Scholarship Committee and instituted a scholarship programme in 2003 to enhance the building of capacity among Ugandans in scientific and technical education. The scholarship programme is aimed at benefiting Ugandans pursuing either undergraduate or graduate studies at University level in Uganda. The scholarship programme has been in operation since 2003/04 academic year.



NATURE OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship shall be extended as a grant payable directly to the University/Institution on behalf of the beneficiaries.

Renewal of funding shall be subject to receiving satisfactory progress reports from the beneficiaries' Faculty/Institute/School.

Retakes in more then 1 subject would entail with-

drawal of Scholarship and shall not be funded by the Trust.

On completion of studies, it is expected that the awardees will, for the benefit of future scholars, make voluntary donations/contributions to the Foundation.

WHAT DOES THE SCHOLARSHIP COVER?

The scholarship covers tuition fees only from second year to completion for undergraduates; and, for the entire programme of study for graduate students from the time of application/award.
